

My dog, Buddy, used to really love walks. When we used to go up the road, his nose was to the ground the whole way. He used to sniff the most interesting smells in his environment. He could tell which rabbit had passed our way. He could tell how long it had been since ducks had been at the lake. He knew when other dogs had wandered along the path. All of this he knew just by smelling his environment.

I observe the environment quite differently. I look at the sky and see the menacing front approaching, and I know that rain is probable. I see the ripples across the lake and can tell the direction of the breeze. The occasional set of webbed prints tell of nesting geese. I can tell all of this by observing the footprints left on the environment by creatures who share it with us.

Everywhere we go, we leave a footprint. The footprints we leave soon create a path for others (including our children) to follow.

This term, we are exploring the different spheres of influence in our lives. Like an onion has many layers, we too have many layers of influence. We start off by looking at the influence that God has in our spheres (heart, mind, and body) and that as a consequence of God's influence in those spheres, He in turn utilises our influenced lives to influence the environments he places us in (home, church, school).

Nits / Head lice Checks

Please check your children for head lice. The ministry of health recommends that parents check their children for head lice at least once a week. Scratching, scratch marks or a rash can be a sign

that your child has head lice. But not all children complain of itchy heads.

At least once a week, check the scalp for head lice insects and eggs, especially around the hairline at the back of the neck, behind the ears, and one top of the head. If you find head lice or eggs, you will need to treat them.
